



Alan "Luke" Miller currently serves as Section Chief of the Critical Incident Response Group (CIRG), Investigative and Operations Support Section (IOSS). In this role, he provides executive leadership over behavior-based investigative support, intelligence analysis, research, advanced training, and secure operational facilities supporting the FBI's most critical and complex investigations.

Luke joined the FBI in January 2002, beginning his career in the El Paso Division, where he investigated white collar crime and counterintelligence matters while serving on the SWAT team and as a firearms and tactical instructor. In 2009, he transferred to the Albuquerque Division, serving on the Joint Terrorism Task Force as a HUMINT agent focused on counterterrorism threats. He again served on SWAT and later became the division's Principal Firearms/Tactical Instructor and Training Coordinator.

Promoted to Supervisory Special Agent in 2017, Luke led a wide range of mission areas, including counterterrorism, WMD, white collar crime, violent crime, public corruption, civil rights, and financial crimes. He was repeatedly entrusted with building and leading interagency task forces spanning terrorism, violent crime, gangs, and child exploitation. He was promoted to FBI Headquarters in 2020, serving as Chief of Staff and Special Assistant at both CCRSB and CIRG before being selected as the Unit Chief for Behavioral Analysis Unit-2. In this role, Luke led a team of cyber and counterintelligence professionals who provide unique behavioral insights for some of the FBI's most complex investigations. He was later selected to be the Assistant Section Chief of IOSS in 2025 before being promoted to Section Chief in 2026.

Prior to joining the FBI, Luke was a Certified Public Accountant and Financial Advisor. He is married with two children and values family, service, and principled leadership.
